

Dealing with the Floods

Many across our community continue to live with the consequences of Storm Babet.



In the past months, I have been busy pressing for action following the flooding many endured because of Storm Babet. It is clear from the state of neglect of our watercourses, ditches, and roads that authorities and agencies need to deliver a comprehensive strategy to clean up our environment and make the necessary repairs to ensure our infrastructure can withstand further instances of flooding.

My message is simple: we cannot be complacent. 1 in 100-year statistics are no comfort. Homes and livelihoods have been impacted. Residents need reassurance that the lessons of Storm Babet are being learned and that work is being done to prevent flooding. We need watercourses dredged, ditches dug out, roads and culverts repaired, ponds built, and the sewage properly treated.

STORM BABET

In March, I met with the **Environment Agency and** Suffolk County Council to call for a comprehensive strategy to clean up the Deben, Ore, and Alde, and step up efforts to work with landowners and residents to ensure the proper upkeep of our drainage, ditches and ponds. Storm Babet also illustrated how some new developments exascerbated problems with water-run off. Drainage conditions must be developed and properly enforced to take account of our recent experiences.

As Chair of the East Suffolk Council's Audit and Governance Committee, I have been busy this past year scrutinising key Council services. From housing and commercial rents to the environment and health, I am calling for efficient, effective, and transparent delivery of services.
